






GRAND MARSHALL N.A.B.O. President
















INTERMOUNTAIN Sheep Dog



Dennis C. Borcha

Born in the California Central Valley, Dennis Borba grew up around fighting bulls. His father was one of the first of the Portuguese community to raise the animals fought in the bloodless bullfights. Acquiring knowledge of the toro bravo so early in life was a valuable asset when he left home for Mexico City to begin his life as a torero in the late seventies. After being a Novillero for 8 years, he took his Alternativa, becoming a full Matador de Toros, on March 27th, 1986. Since then, he has fought bulls on foot and on horseback in Mexico, Peru, Spain and Portugal.

Dennis Borba was on the movie set during 2006, coordinating stunts that involved bulls crashing through windows and into swimming pools. The sequel to the 2002 movie Jackass stars Johnny Knoxville and Bam Margera; released September, 2006.

The Dennis Borba Bullfighting school was featured in the Wall Street Journal and featured on the 1st episode of Top Gear USA, fighting Lamborghini.










Qunior Weight Carrying Contest

Handling horses was a passion and he held high respect for those that would rather be a lonely shepherd. Biotzetik Basque Choir

Biotzetik, ("Bee-oats-eh-teek") which in Basque means "from the heart," was founded in 1986 and was, at that time, the only Basque choir in the U.S. The choir is comprised of approximately 50 volunteer members, both Basque and non-Basque, who perform yearround for community events, weddings, funerals, fundraisers and other activities. Special annual performances hosted by the choir include "Kantari Afaria," or musical dinner, a popular Boise event during which patrons enjoy an authentic Basque dinner, music and a lively auction. This is a major fundraiser for the choir, and is routinely sold out each year. The choir serves as music ministers for the annual Basque mass at St. John's Cathedral in honor of St. Ignatius of Loyola. They sing at St. Mary's Catholic Church each year for the Easter Vigil mass. The choir additionally co-sponsors Omenaldia, a memorial mass, held at Sacred Heart Catholic Church each year near the feast of All Saints. At Christmastime, the choir performs a holiday concert sung in Basque and English at the beautiful St. John's Cathedral in Boise, and spreads holiday cheer to senior citizens through a day of Christmas caroling at local homes for the elderly. During each Jaialdi Basque Festival held in Boise, the choir has performed in several key venues. From the opening ceremonies at the Western Idaho Fairgrounds to special ceremonies for Basque Presidents, to the Festa'ra, a showcase of music and dance at the Morrison Center, the choir is an integral part of this major festival that is held in Boise every five years. Biotzetik has sung throughout Idaho, Nevada, Oregon, Washington State and Vancouver, British Columbia, and in 2001 and 2006 traveled to the Basque country to perform, and participated in music workshops.
