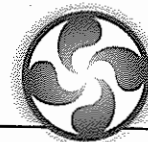

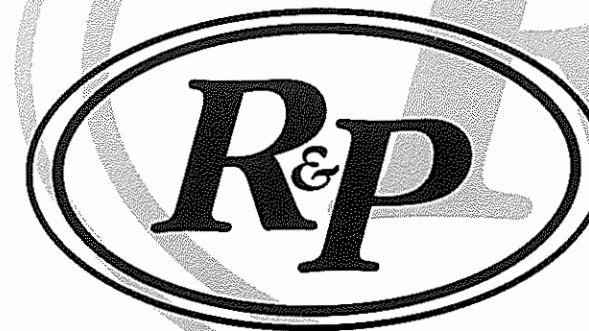

Mercedes Mendive

Grand Marshall of the 47th National Basque Festival

Mercedes Mendive was born and raised in Elko, Nevada. Throughout her young childhood, she had always had strong music influences long before she began playing the accordion. Her first influences in Basque Music were ultimately prompted by her dad Joe, and later nurtured by her mentor Bernardo Yanci. One of the advantages to the style of music that ultimately became her preferred genre was that she was fortunate enough to have "live accordion music" being played every Saturday morning at Basque Dancing practices. These dance practices would also play a pivotal role in teaching her the fundamentals of music and rhythms long before she became a musician.



At the age of ten she picked up an accordion for the first time. She remembers thinking back to those early days when she was just beginning her musical journey and wondering where it might take her one day, if any place at all. "I remember in the beginning I was just learning the basic fundamentals about the accordion and about music in general. I couldn't play but just a few songs at the time, but the one thing I was absolutely certain of was that it felt right. Everything about the accordion for me was right."

Over the next several years Bernardo Yanci would play a huge role in shaping her talents. He would come every Saturday morning to teach her without missing a beat. He became one of her greatest mentors, but more than that, he became her friend. His incomparable style and talent would have huge impacts on Mercedes over the years that followed, all of which could never be duplicated.

In 2003 Mercedes wrote and composed ten songs for her debut CD Journey to Euskdai. "The majority of the music," she explains, "has primarily Basque influence and undertones, but it was also important for me to blend it with something a little more modern... to try to give it something of a contemporary feel, which, in retrospect, I think I was able to accomplish that."

Mercedes has performed at a multitude of venues in various cities throughout the United States as well as town fiestas in the Basque Country. Some of her performances include her debut CD concert in Gardnerville, Nevada; the prestigious International Accordion Festival in San Antonio, Texas; Jaialde; NABO conventions; Basque festivals throughout the western United States; The Florida "Accordion Smash" in Orlando; Great Basin Community College's Cultural Week; John Ascuaga's Casino in Reno, Nevada, as well as a cameo on stage for pop music group Haley for her debut album release at Bimbos night club in San Francisco; as well as many others.

Although Mercedes now lives on the southern east coast of Florida, she continues to write music in hope of getting back into the studio sooner rather than later. Her musical priorities have somewhat taken a back-seat to her daughter, whom was born in November 2008, but she always makes time to play when she can. "I used to find the greatest amount of calm and joy in just sitting down for an afternoon and practicing and playing a little music, but since my daughter was born, I take much more pleasure in seeing her interrupt my practices by pushing miscellaneous keys on the accordion while I'm trying to play it. Granted, I don't get a lot done that way, but I know that I, too, am influencing and nurturing a happy and musical child in some capacity. It's my hope that this influence will be the reason my daughter too will have a song in her heart long before she picks up an instrument. For me, there is no greater gift I can offer her or receive from her."

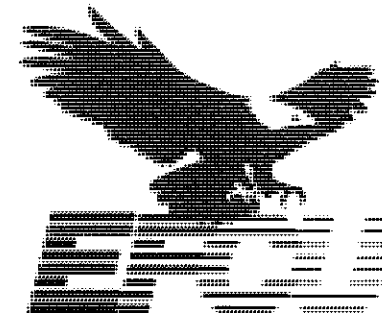

From the very first Elko Basque Club Meeting

The following officers were nominated:

President - John Aguirre

Vice President - Joe Urriola

Treasurer - Marguerite Aguirre

Board of Directors:

Louie Urriarte, Albert Samper and Lenore Halbert.

The following items were brought up for discussion. Initiation fees per person at \$10.00 a year. Meetings to be held once a month. Louie Uriarte is to see about getting the Elk's Hall. Adele Shust and Mary Wunderlich are to provide the entertainment for the next meeting to be held Tuesday, January 5. A committee to be appointed for the social of each meeting. It was discussed about getting Basque hats to wear and each to buy their own. Joe Anacabe was asked to look into the buying of them. It was discussed to have our meeting put on social calendar of K.E.L.K. and also in the Free Press. Decided on having membership cards made up. The Board of Directors and the officers are to meet at the Nevada Hotel on December 22.

The Board of Directors and the officer held their meeting at the Nevada Hotel on December 22. I got the by-laws that were used in Idaho and Winnemucca and we discussed them to see what changes we wanted to make. The committee decided that \$6.00 per person a year would be the dues of the club instead of ten. Louie Urriarte is to talk to Pat Mann about incorporating. Different ideas were brought up about having these committees; a sick committee, an entertainment committee, a finance committee, a membership committee and a committee to help the Basques who do not speak English with their needs.

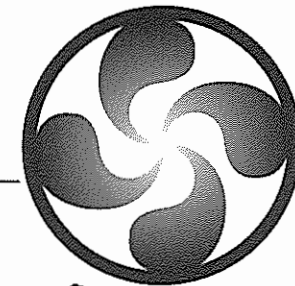
BILTÓKI

"The Gathering Place"

Ramon Zugazaga arrived in Elko May 15, 1965, under contract with the Holland Ranch, the same outfit his father had worked on between 1919 and 1927 and where his brother was then employed. Employees often told their employers of relatives or friends who were interested in coming over to work; employers had a source of reliable workers and the new employees benefitted from having friends or relatives help them adjust to their new surroundings.

Ramon summered with the sheep just west of Jarbridge and then trailed them to their winter range south of Ely (300 miles). In the spring, the trip was reversed with the sheep arriving at the Home Ranch for shearing and lambing in May. After five years on the ranch, Ramon went to work at the Star Hotel, where he cooked until 1978. In 1981, he opened the Biltoki in Gooding, Idaho. Ramon moved the Biltoki to Elko in November of 1983. This property was originally called the Corner Bar and was operated by Maria and Antonio Jaurgui for many years. The bar and a small rental house next to it were combined to form the present building, which was a pizza parlor prior to Ramon's occupancy. Ramon grew up around his mother's restaurant, which is still run by his sister in Gernika, Vizcaya. Many of the dishes found on the Biltoki special board were learned at his mother's side. Biltoki's family style method of serving originated in the Basque Hotels with the strong ranch influence dictating the use of much beef and lamb.

Ramon Zugazaga is proud to carry on the Basque traditions in the American West.

Team members can relieve each other at any time by tagging, but only one member can be working at any time and in any order they wish.

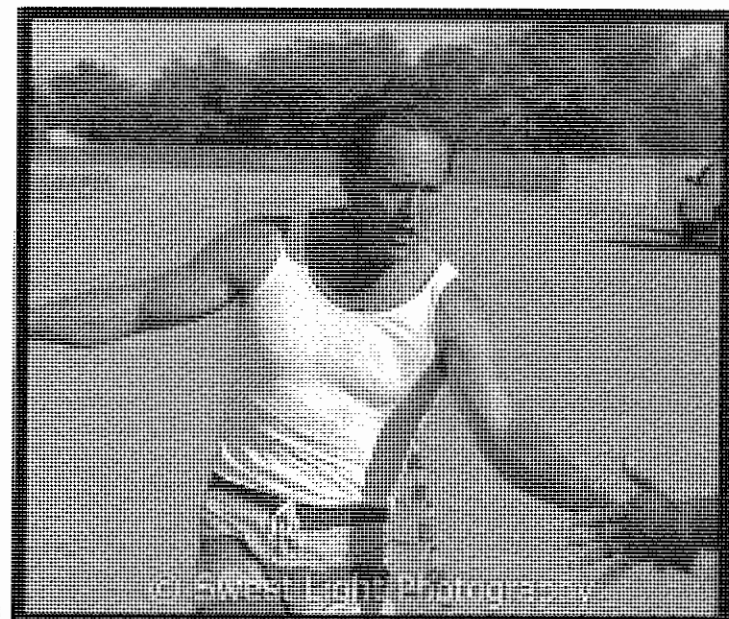
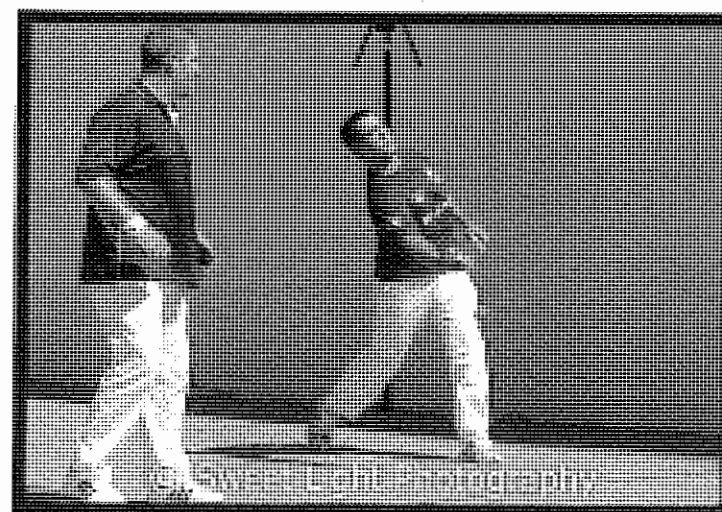
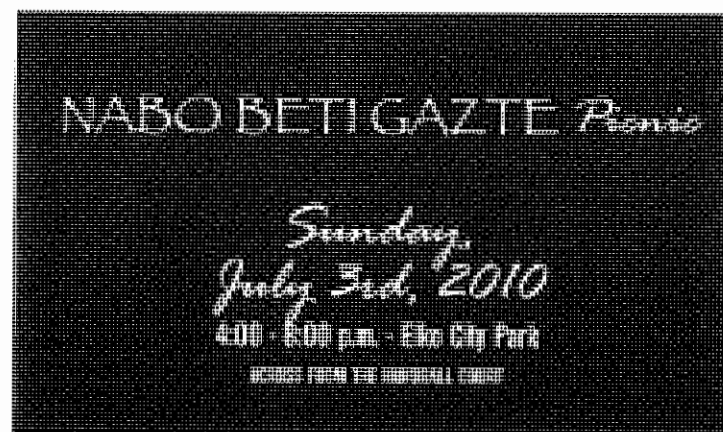
